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Style guide for Turkey Times

Text font: The body copy of a story should be in 9.5 point Times New Roman. This can vary a little bit to suit our purposes and to fill a page, but it should not vary by much, i.e. .5 points either way from 9 to 10.

Headlines: The first (or main) headline on a page should be in Arial Black. Lesser headlines should be in Times New Roman. More prominent stories should appear near the top of the page and have bigger headlines. Less prominent stories should appear lower on the page and have a smaller headline. No headline should be any smaller than 16 points.

Bylines: The byline should include the author's name and title. The name should appear on the first line in 8 point Arial Black and the title should appear on the second line in 8 point Arial.

Photos and cutlines: Photo boxes should be surrounded by a .5 point black line. Cutlines should use complete sentences in 8 point Arial Black to describe what the picture is about.

Some layout and design tips:

- Leave some air around your layout elements like headlines, cutlines and pictures. Cramming too much together makes a page hard to read.
- Use graphic elements like pulled quotes, headshots and pictures to eliminate gray space on a page (i.e. too much text)
- Avoid bumping headlines or anything else that might be confusing to the reader.
- Be creative and make your page easy on the eyes within our style.
